FROM THE DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Dear Wahoo Nation,

The 2025–26 academic year presented extraordinary challenges across collegiate athletics. Rather than simply navigating change, we embraced it as an opportunity to elevate the University of Virginia and further distinguish our athletics program as a national model for excellence. Thanks to your steadfast support, our student-athletes, coaches and staff rose to the occasion in remarkable ways.

Virginia finished fifth in the final Learfield Directors' Cup standings, marking our third top-five finish in the last four years and our seventh consecutive top-15 finish—a testament to the sustained excellence of our athletics program.

Our success in competition was exceptional. National championships in women's swimming and men's tennis highlighted an outstanding year that also included 11 NCAA individual titles and five ACC team championships. Since the spring of 2002, Virginia has won 103 ACC championships—more than any other conference institution during that span.

Several of our programs achieved significant milestones. Football recorded a school-record 11 victories, earned a Gator Bowl win over Missouri, and advanced to the ACC Championship Game. Men's basketball returned to the NCAA Tournament after a 30-win season, while women's basketball earned its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2018 and advanced to its first Sweet 16 since 2000.

Our commitment to excellence extends well beyond competition. Virginia matched its highest-ever NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 96%, reflecting the dedication of our student-athletes in the classroom. We also celebrated ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors for Will Bettridge (football), Claire Curzan (women's swimming & diving), Dylan Dietrich (men's tennis), Gary Martin (men's indoor track & field), Umberto Pelà (men's soccer), and Jeremiah Nubbe (men's outdoor track & field).

None of these achievements would be possible without you.

Your generosity creates opportunities for our student-athletes to compete at the highest level, pursue a world-class education, and develop into leaders who represent the University of Virginia with integrity and pride. Every victory, every championship, every academic achievement is made possible, in part, because you believe in our mission.

As collegiate athletics continues to evolve, your partnership is more important than ever. Together, we will continue to provide an unparalleled student-athlete experience and ensure that Virginia remains a national leader—on the field, in the classroom and in our community.

Thank you for your commitment to Virginia Athletics and for investing in the success of our student-athletes. The fight in our coaches, staff and student-athletes is inspiring, and it uplifts the entire University community. We are grateful for the record-breaking support

Dear Virginia Fans,

As we reflect on an extraordinary 2025-26 academic year for Virginia Athletics, I want to begin by expressing my heartfelt gratitude for your unwavering commitment to our more than 750 student-athletes and 27 sports.

While football serves as the financial engine of Virginia Athletics, generating critical revenue that helps advance our mission, every sport, including football and basketball, relies on philanthropic support to provide a championship-caliber student-athlete experience. This uniquely interconnected model allows donors to support the programs and priorities they are most passionate about while creating opportunities across all 27 sports.

Thanks to your support, 2025 became the most successful fundraising year in the Virginia Athletics Foundation's 77-year history. More than 11,000 VAF members invested a record \$120.4 million in the future of Virginia Athletics, surpassing our previous record of \$87.3 million set in 2022. The VAF Annual Fund generated more than \$17.7 million to support all 27 sports, while the Sabre Society grew to over 950 members and has generated more than \$155.1 million in philanthropic impact since its launch in 2024.

The response to the new JPI Seating Plan was inspiring. During calendar year 2025, supporters contributed \$28.5 million, demonstrating an extraordinary level of commitment to Virginia Basketball. That momentum has continued into 2026 and reflects our shared belief that Virginia Basketball should remain among the nation's premier programs.

For 77 years, the Virginia Athletics Foundation has been built on that trust you place in Virginia Athletics. Our responsibility is to be stewards of your investment by communicating the priorities of Virginia Athletics, honoring donor intent, and connecting your passions with opportunities to make a lasting impact.

Virginia finished fifth nationally in the Learfield Directors' Cup standings, marking our third top five finish in four years. We celebrated national championships in women's swimming and men's tennis, captured 11 NCAA individual titles and five ACC team championships, and witnessed football achieve a school-record 11 victories. Men's and women's basketball also returned to NCAA Tournament play.

Virginia matched its highest-ever NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 96 percent, while 548 student-athletes earned a GPA of 3.00 or higher, including 47 who achieved a perfect 4.00 GPA. Notably, football recorded the highest fall GPA in program history during the same season it achieved the most wins in school history, while men's basketball and baseball also posted record-setting fall GPAs.

Thank you for your trust, partnership, and generosity. Together, we are building an extraordinary legacy and ensuring that future Cavaliers have every opportunity to learn, compete, lead, and reach their full potential.

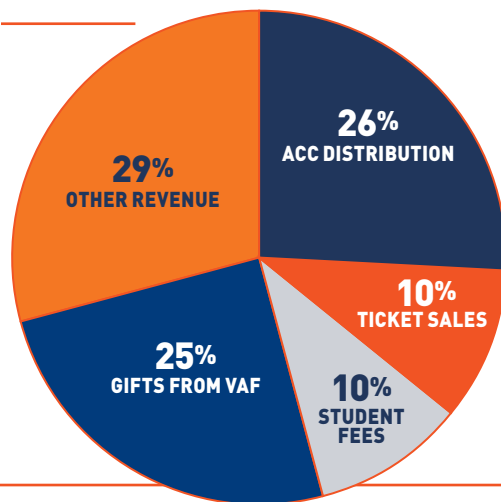

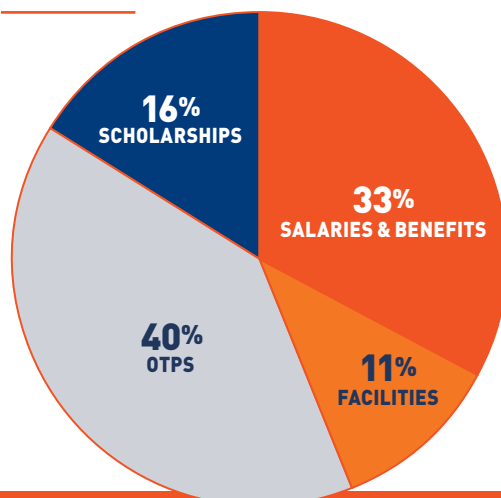

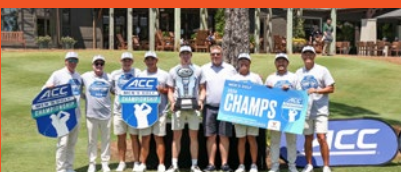

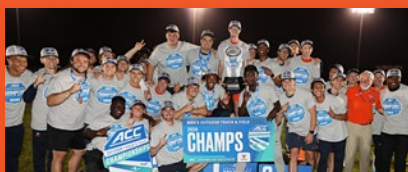

HARRISON FAMILY OLYMPIC SPORTS CENTER

Virginia Athletics and the Virginia Athletics Foundation are grateful for the loyal and generous supporters whose philanthropy continues to elevate the student-athlete experience. The Harrison family's lead gift made possible another major milestone in the University's Athletics Master Plan.

Officially unveiled on September 11, 2025, the Harrison Family Olympic Sports Center at the Ramon W. Breeden Athletic Grounds marked the completion of a \$75 million project that includes the new Olympic sports center and the renovation of the McCue Center. Connected to the McCue Center, the Harrison Center serves all 27 varsity programs and features locker rooms for eight Olympic sports, team meeting rooms and lounges, strength and conditioning and sports medicine spaces, equipment and sports nutrition areas, staff offices, and an outdoor terrace. The facility provides world-class resources that empower Virginia student-athletes to compete at the highest level while excelling in the classroom and beyond.



Made possible by a lead \$25 million gift from the family of the late David and Mary Harrison, two of UVA's most generous benefactors, the Harrison Family Olympic Sports Center stands as a lasting investment in the future of Virginia Athletics. During the unveiling ceremony, student-athletes Mia Abello and Umberto Pelà reflected on how the facility raises the standard of excellence and creates new opportunities for Cavaliers to grow as competitors, students, and leaders.





UVA DEDICATES RAMON W. BREEDEN ATHLETIC GROUNDS

A dedicating ceremony was held in appreciation of the Breeden family, longtime supporters of the University. Ramon W. Breeden Jr., a 1956 graduate of the McIntire School of Commerce, made a \$75 million gift to the university, with \$25 million toward the Virginia Athletics Master Plan in 2023.





LOCKHART FAMILY ESTABLISHES MEN'S TENNIS COACH ENDOWED FUND

The University of Virginia announced the creation of a fund to permanently support its championship men's tennis program, a first step toward a future in which UVA envisions self-sustaining operations for all Olympic sports.

The new Lockhart Family Head Men's Tennis Coach Endowed Fund reflects a creative solution for collegiate sports, modeling an approach for athletics programs that share uncertain, rapidly changing futures and constrained funding, particularly for Olympic sports.

The Lockhart Family Head Men's Tennis Coach Endowed Fund was created through a gift from H. Eugene "Gene" Lockhart Jr. and Terry J. Lockhart. The couple are longtime supporters of many areas of UVA – and particularly of the tennis program, where Gene mentors and advises players weekly – and they have generously endowed scholarships.

Gene Lockhart earned his UVA engineering degree as well as an MBA from UVA's Darden School of Business. Terry Lockhart is a graduate of the College of Arts & Sciences. Both Terry and Gene have been engaged across the Grounds, and the commonwealth, for decades as strong advocates for higher education.

The fund establishes an endowment that will, in perpetuity, provide funds for the men's tennis program's annual expenses. The initial gift provides a foundation – along with a number of scholarship endowments funded by the Lockharts and other UVA donors – to hopefully endow the entire men's tennis program in the future.

"Terry and I are excited to partner with the University of Virginia, UVA Athletics and head tennis coach Andres Pedroso to forge a new path that benefits the team and the University," Gene Lockhart said. "UVA men's tennis is



an incredibly successful program known for developing championship teams and outstanding people, especially under the inspiring leadership of Andres. We're grateful to be involved in a new approach that helps sustain that excellence and solidify Virginia's place as one of the top programs in the country."

Pedroso, now the Lockhart Family Head Men's Tennis Coach, was named the ITA National Men's Coach of the Year in 2022 and 2023 before earning the honor for a third time in 2026. He is also a three-time ACC Coach of the Year and Wilson ITA Atlantic Region Coach of the Year. Under his leadership, the Cavaliers captured ACC Championships in 2021, 2022, and 2023, as well as NCAA Championships in 2022, 2023, and 2026.

Over the past several years and through the generosity of UVA alumni, the head coaching positions for men's tennis, men's golf, football and men's basketball have been endowed. UVA aims to endow all its head coaching positions and to have a greater emphasis on endowment fundraising through the Virginia Athletics Foundation over the next decade.

548 student-athletes (80%) earned a **3.00 GPA** or higher.

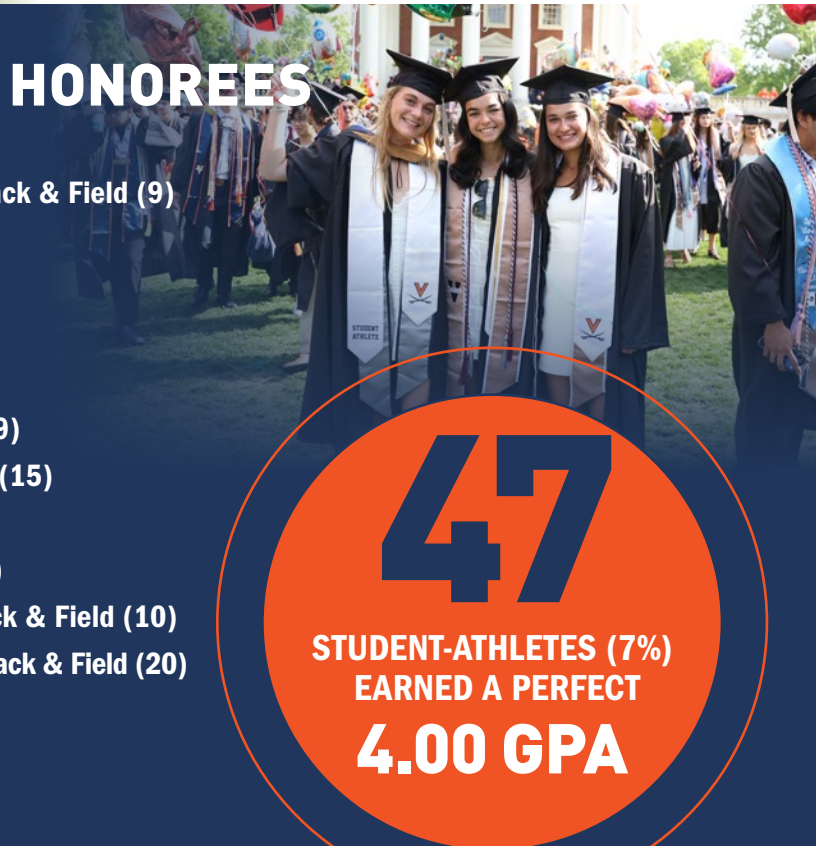

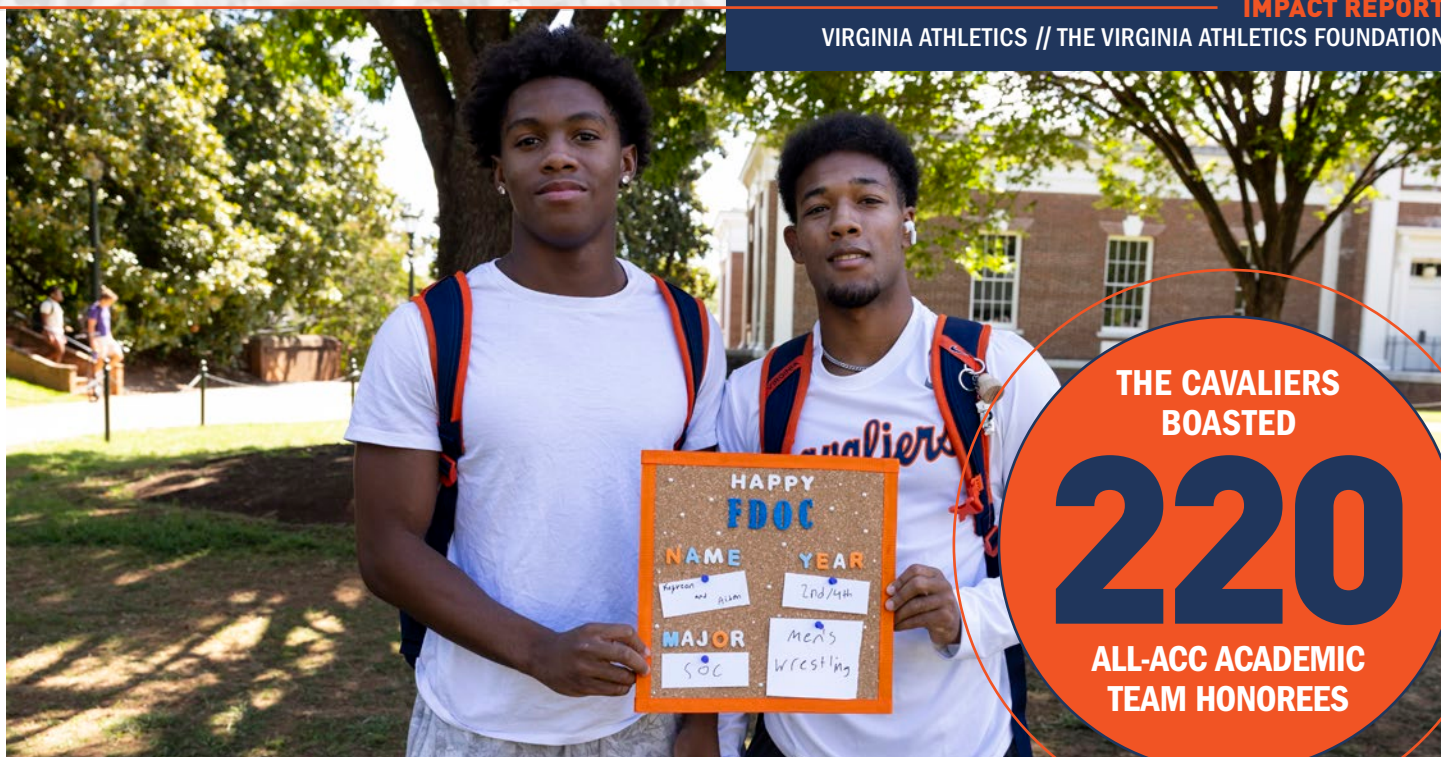

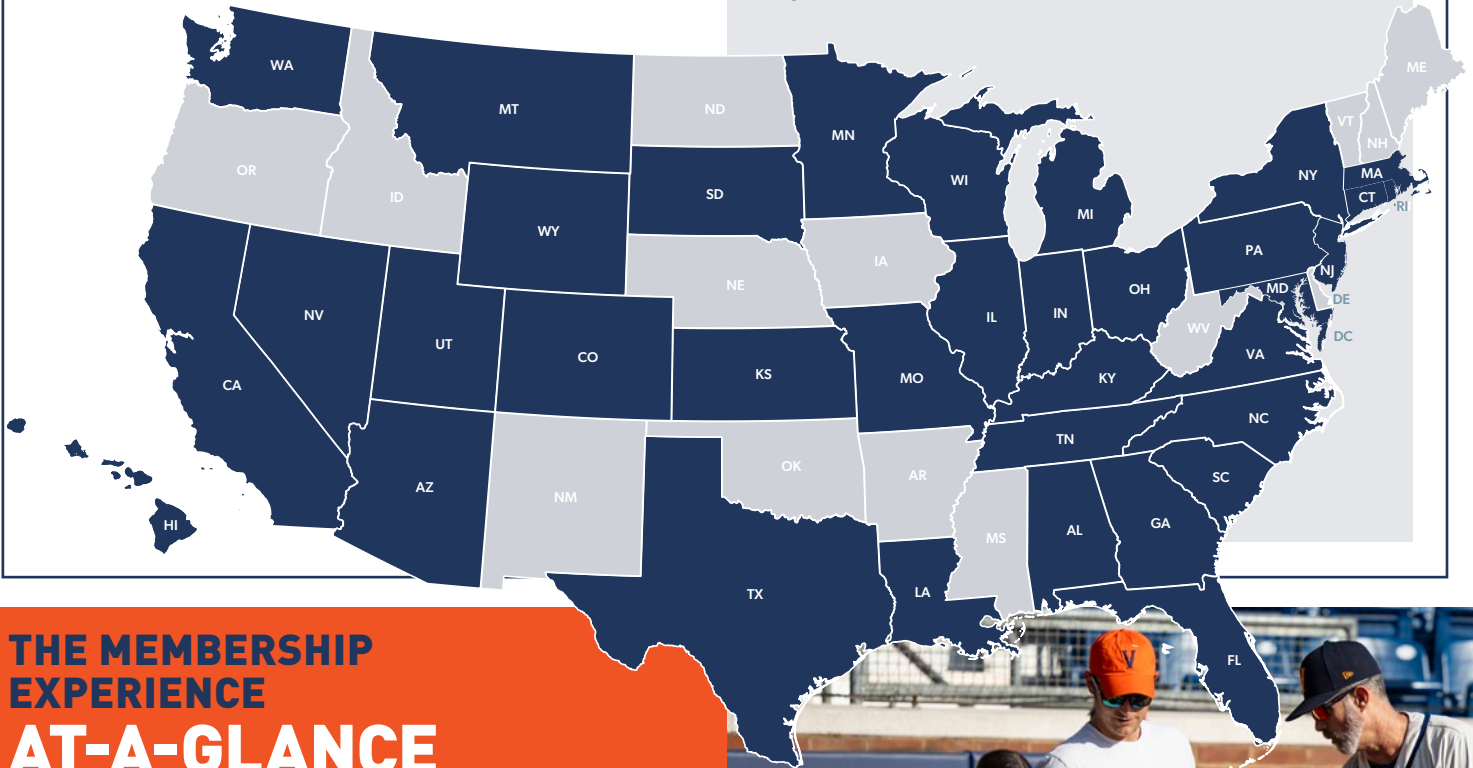

SCHOLARSHIPS

Last year, 85% of our **scholarships** were provided to out-of-state student-athletes with 15% provided to in-state student-athletes. Annual Fund donations, along with endowment distributions, fund unrestricted current use athletics scholarships. To support the scholarship of a specific sport, donors have the option to allocate some or all of their annual fund gift to that sport(s) through the Friends Of program. Annual Fund and Friends Of gifts, regardless of size, help create opportunities for Virginia student-athletes. By investing annually and through endowments, donors play a direct role in sustaining scholarship opportunities at the University of Virginia.

THE ANNUAL FUND

The Annual Fund, which includes sport-specific current-use scholarship gifts made through Friends Of designations, includes gifts made by University of Virginia fans including alumni, student-athlete alumni, friends, and businesses. In 2025, more than 11,000 individuals gave more than \$17.7 million to help our teams compete in the ACC and on the national stage.

Gifts to the Annual Fund, along with endowment distributions, support athletics scholarships, and the academic experience of all our student-athletes. The growth of the Annual Fund is critical to funding scholarships in the future.

ENDOWMENT

An **endowment** gift is one of the most powerful gifts a donor can make to Virginia Athletics. Endowed funds provide a lasting source of support for Virginia Athletics. Gifts can be made to establish endowed scholarship funds or sport-specific operational funds to assist with annual budgetary needs.

In 2025, the Virginia Athletics Foundation (VAF) was responsible for raising the necessary funds to support all athletics scholarships allowed by the NCAA. Distributions from scholarship endowments provide approximately 15% of the funding each year for student-athlete scholarships.

Endowment gifts are held and invested by the University. Each year, VAF can draw upwards of 5% of the endowment total to apply to the cost of scholarships.

This philanthropic support is crucial to not only the ongoing success of our sports, but also to securing the future of our programs, as it allows us to provide scholarships to help attract the best student-athletes to compete for conference and national championships and maintain elite academic standards. These scholarships also provide life-changing opportunities for our student-athletes so they can pursue excellence in competition, in the classroom, and in service to the broader community.

For the 2025-2026 academic year, we had 173 endowed scholarships. 18 additional endowed scholarships were added for the upcoming 2026-2027 year, making the new total 191.

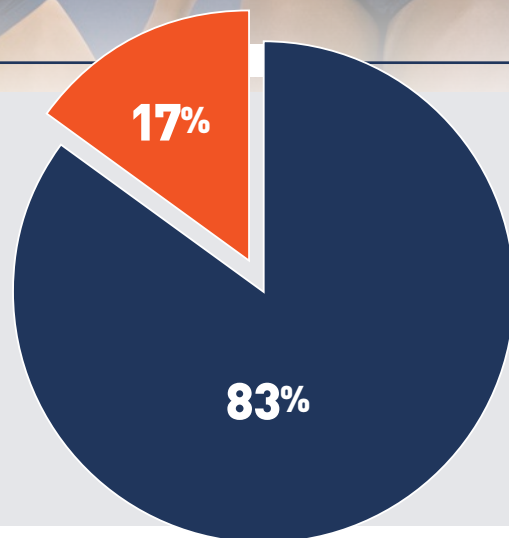

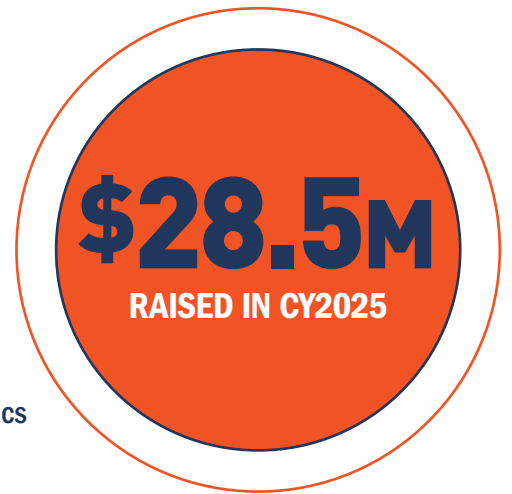
MEN'S BASKETBALL SEATING PLAN

The Virginia Men's Basketball Seating Plan is being implemented as the original John Paul Jones Arena (JPJ) seat licenses expire at the conclusion of the 2026-27 men's basketball season. This provides current supporters with the opportunity to renew their seat licenses while strengthening the long-term sustainability, fan experience, and competitive success of Virginia Men's Basketball and Virginia Athletics as a whole.

Agreements signed under the new seat licenses will go through the 2031-32 season.

Following the renewal campaign process each year prior to an upcoming season, any remaining available seats will be offered to current and prospective supporters on the JPJ Interest List, creating opportunities for fans to continue and become part of the Virginia Basketball gameday experience.

Whether you're looking to renew your current seats, explore relocation opportunities, or become a season ticket member for the first time, the new seat-licenses provide a process that prioritizes existing supporters while welcoming new members of the Virginia Basketball family. The basketball plan provides the Athletics Department with increased flexibility to raise funds necessary for operating the basketball programs. These new agreements will help address the immediate needs of Virginia Athletics to maintain competitive excellence in the ever-changing landscape of college athletics including increased scholarship costs for our student-athletes, a cost that has more than doubled since the original JPJ seat licenses first went into effect.

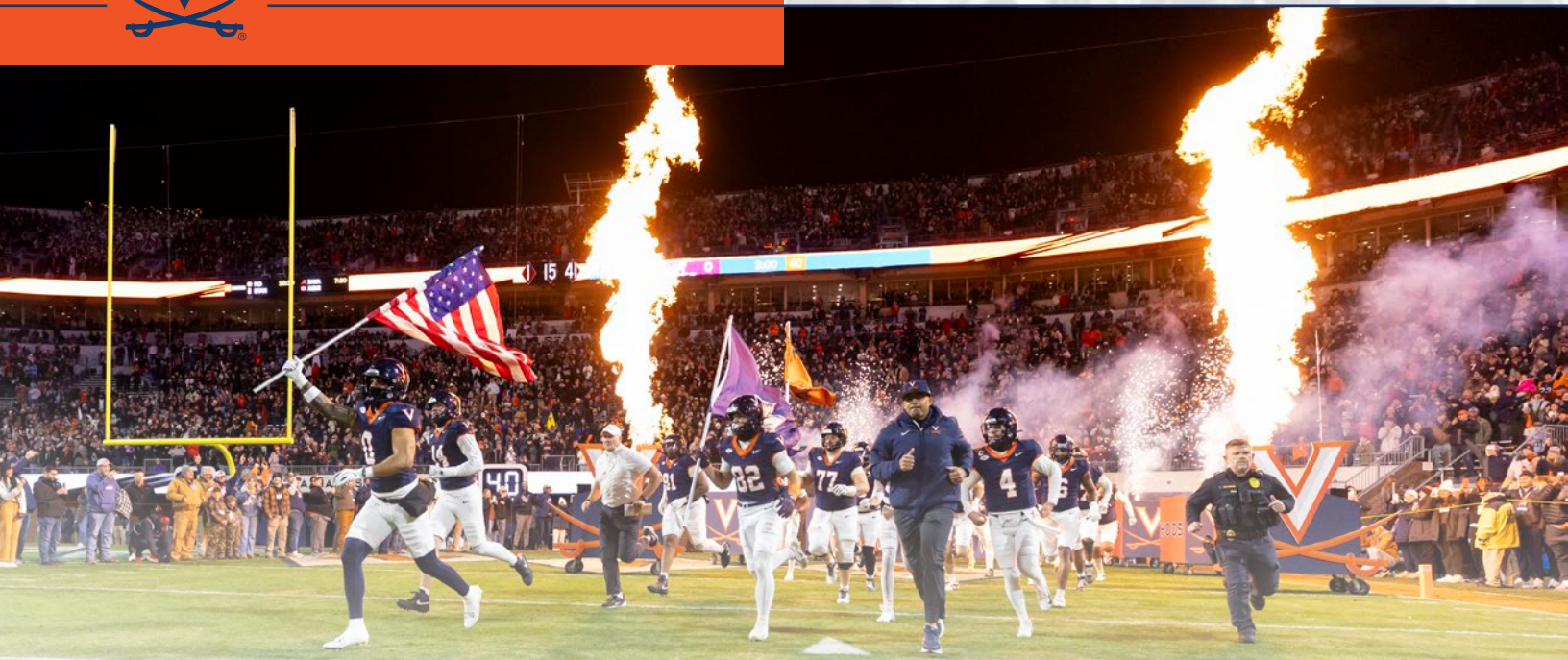
